



COLD ASHBY VILLAGE MEMORIAL HALL

Just over a year ago, our Village Memorial Hall had an uncertain future and was looking for new trustees with a vision to save this much-loved village building and put it back to being the heart of the community like it had been for many years. Fortunately, four new trustees came forward and working with the rest of the committee, who are made up of representatives from local groups in the village, the Memorial Hall has been given a new lease of life and during the past year has provided our residents with a much-needed place for recreational and social activities.

This year, the hall celebrated its 102nd birthday. It was built as a memorial to those from the village who lost their lives in World War One and is included on the war memorials register by The Imperial War Museum. It was built by two villagers, Gus Bott and Tom Letts from land gifted from another villager Stephen Matthew. All funds for the building were raised by the local community. Community has always been important to the residents of Cold Ashby and as a child growing up in the village, I remember the times when the whole village turned up for an event or 'do' and ensured that the heart of village life continued. Even though we live in different times, it is still relevant and important today that the whole of the village gets behind local events and gives their support to keep village buildings and organisations going strong. We are lucky in Cold Ashby to have two such facilities, the Memorial Hall and the Playing Fields Pavilion, who provide entertainment and social events for all of the residents. Both organisations are run by committed, dedicated volunteers, but they need the support of the whole village to help keep them going.

Throughout December and January, there are a variety of events planned for our community and we would love to see everyone joining us...we really do need the whole village's support and you will be made most welcome.

GENERAL NEW AND FUNDING

The GPFA, created in 1977, through funds raised by villagers, is a charity (275828) and independent organisation that manages the sporting activities, and maintains and improves the sporting



facilities. The General Committee is composed of village volunteers and representatives of sporting clubs, and 3 village trustees review that the GPFA's charity objects are met.

Around 2000 juniors and adults use the facility each year for cricket, football and school sports.

The GPFA funds the annual fixed/operating cost of about £12,000 p.a. About 35% comes from the sports clubs and others that use it, the remainder by efforts of volunteers without any contribution from the Parish stipend to fixed costs eg mowing (£2,500), insurance (£1,500), ground perimeter maintenance (£1,500), cricket square (£2,500), electric & water services (£1,000), statutory tree and building services inspections (£1,000), equipment repairs service (£1,500).

The GPFA will launch an appeal to Parishioners in 2023 and others for help to raise funds towards fixed costs.

The very busy cricket season has now finished and football has commenced with Under 12s and Under 16s teams playing at the Field on Saturday and Sunday.

Fortunately, there were a lot of singers and so the first production began rehearsals with 40 people on stage and many backstage helpers. The Director was Nigel Townsend.

The show was performed at the County School with audiences of 300. The group's excellent reputation continued with other musicals including *Oklahoma*, *Carousel*, *The Merry Widow*, *Kiss Me Kate*, *My Fair Lady* and *Calamity Jane*.

With escalating costs of hall hiring, the group moved to the Village Hall, becoming GMADS. This offered opportunities for straight plays, comedies, reviews, pantomimes and Christmas shows - A Christmas Carol, Mr Pickwick's Christmas and An Elizabethan Christmas where the Spanish Armada was acted out with galleons and Queen Elizabeth in full sail.

NODA, the national association for amateur drama, awarded Best Play in the East Midlands to Noel Coward's *Hayfever*, John Buchan's *The 39 Steps* and Alan Ayckbourn's *Season's Greetings*. *Spectres, Spies and Flying Pigs* was home-written, telling the fascinating story of Guilsborough's history. £80,000 FROM HOLLOWELL STEAM

It was great to see Allen Eaton MBE once again leading the Hollowell Steam "Give Away" on a dark, wet evening in early November. Allen and his wife Jane stepped out of retirement earlier in the year to take over the running of the Rally for one last time, in a bid to secure its future.

The Give Away is a particularly special evening, when the profits from the summer rally are handed out to a wide variety of local charities and good causes. This year presented a number of difficulties: the loss of the camping field and one of the parking areas, plus a struggle to secure marquees and a rain-battered Saturday.



Will it be a Waxwing Winter?

The Waxwing is a scarce winter visitor in the British Isles, subject to occasional irruptions, when large numbers move south and west from their breeding territories in Scandinavia and northern Europe. The last Waxwing invasion that I can recall in Northants occurred in the winter of 2016-2017. The photo above is of one of a party of birds that spent a few days feeding around the perimeter fence at Sywell Airfield.

As I write this in early November, Waxwings appear to be on the move, with large numbers reported dispersing across northern Europe. There are also early signs of arrival in Britain, with parties of birds seen in Shetland, Moray, Northumberland, Norfolk and – tantalisingly close to home - three flying south over Croft Hill in Leicestershire just a couple of days ago. At this stage it's too early to say whether this is a vanguard of an invasion – or just part of normal winter movements.

Waxwings are characterful birds with a striking appearance. They can appear Starling-like when seen in silhouette – and may also move in similar large flock formations to the Starling – but if seen properly Waxwings are unmistakeable: pinkish grey overall, with black, white yellow and red contrasts on the wing and tail feathers, a black bib and eye-mask and a large crest. They are also vocal at times: their distinctive silvery call 'ssiiirrr' may reveal their presence in the nearby area.

Waxwings are generally active, restless and nervy, moving quickly away when disturbed, but they can also be very visible as they frequent areas of ornamental planting in residential, municipal and commercial areas, including gardens and parkland and also roadsides, traffic islands and supermarket car parks (in the 2016-2017 invasion they seemed to prefer Sainsburys!).

Favoured food plants are native Rowan and Hawthorn and ornamental varieties of Sorbus, Pyracantha and Cotoneaster.

When they find a suitable food source they may linger, only moving on when they have stripped the trees of all their berries.



In times of food shortage they may feed on frost-damaged or semifermented fruit and become incapacitated and unable to fly; they have evolved highly efficient liver function as a way of minimising the risks of this.

With their striking appearance and lively habits, combined with their scarcity, Waxwings generate high levels of interest in the birding community and lots of coverage on social media. News of a Waxwing invasion will spread quickly around the bird-news sources and chat groups, there is even a Twitter account @WaxwingsUK dedicated to monitoring and sharing their movements.

It might seem unusual for me to be writing about a bird that often doesn't feature locally, but you never know... over the next couple of months we may be fortunate enough to catch up with a flock of these characterful birds.


