

#### Sloes - A Bumper Crop

This year has been a "mast year" meaning that we've had a bumper crop of fruits and nuts. Mast years typically happen every three to five years, the last being in 2020. A mast year typically occurs as a reaction to environmental triggers such as the weather. It means that certain trees overproduce in the hope that there will be an overwhelming number of fruit/nuts, enough to sustain wildlife and to also ensure that enough seeds survive to grow into trees.



Whether it's meant more crumbles, jams, preserves or a cheeky sloe gin tipple there has been plenty of fruit to be harvested or foraged to make the most of the season's offerings. Why not try our simple Sloe Gin recipe.

#### Ingredients:

500g Sloe berries 250g Caster sugar I Litre of Gin


#### Method:

- Wash your berries and check for any bugs
- Split the sloe berry skins, this can be done by pricking with a skewer, soaking in water, or freezing overnight and allowing to defrost
- Combine all of your ingredients together in a 2 litre jar or two smaller ones
- Give everything a good mix up and then shake daily for 7 days and store in a cool dark place for 2-3 months
- Line a sieve with a muslin square and set over a bowl and strain the gin through it
- Decant into clean dry bottles and then seal and label. It can be enjoyed right away but will mature and taste even better the following year


#### EAGA Gospel Choir at All Saints Church

#### Briefing on Upgrade to LED of Street - Lamps Hollowell & Teeton Parish

The Parish Council continues to review the options to upgrade the street lamps to LED as this reduces the charges for electricity and maintenance. The Parish Council has responsibility for 32 street lamps.

In 2023 the Council was required to undertake an inspection of all 32 Street Lamps within the parish to comply with BS 7671. This was completed by the Street Lamp Maintenance Contractor Eon, and the subsequent report identified Street Lamp No. 10, fitted on a bracket, to be 'in a very poor condition' and failed the inspection which is why it has been replaced with a steel pole and upgraded to LED 18 watt.

Eon has since advised that when they surveyed the lights, they found that some of the brackets were still in good condition and did not need to be replaced, but as part of a quotation to upgrade to LED Eon identified 8 brackets requiring replacement.

In May 2025 eight Lamps fitted to brackets were upgraded with LED lights and dusk to dawn photocells by Eon. [PLS 6, 20 & 30 CHURCH HILL HWLL, PLS 11,12,13 & 14 GUILSBOROUGH HILL HWLL, PL 24 CREATON LANE TEETON] at a cost of £3,712.80 incl. VAT.

Monies received from WNC as part of Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) funding was used for the upgrade to LED.

#### Option to Upgrade to LED:

The Council has received further CIL funding and this provides an opportunity to upgrade the remaining lamps in Teeton. PL 21 RAVENSTHORPE RD TEETON, PL 22 HOLDENBY RD TEETON, PL 23 CREATON LANE TEETON, PL 32 RAVENSTHORPE RD TEETON.

Lamp 22 would retain the PART NIGHT CELL and Lamp 23 would be fitted with a rear shield in response to comments from residents. **Total Cost**: £1280.00 + vat £256.00 = £1536.00.

#### Pectoral Sandpiper at Hollowell

With this year's largely dry weather, water levels at Hollowell Reservoir have been favourable for wading birds, with extensive areas of exposed muddy shoreline. Late summer and early autumn – usually the peak period for waders - were however rather quiet. It was therefore pleasing in the first week of October to find a notable wader in the form of a Pectoral Sandpiper.

On the morning of October 2<sup>nd</sup>, I had completed the first half of a lap of the reservoir when I spotted a wader standing in the water, apparently asleep, just north of Guilsborough Bay Point. On first impression I thought I was looking at a Ruff, based on size, general shape and structure; I'd also seen a few of these over preceding weeks at Hollowell and Pitsford Reservoirs. I was at this point looking south in poor early-morning light, so the view wasn't good enough for a conclusive ID. I moved around to my right, across the grassy meadow and skirted around to get a view in better light.

From my new vantage point, I could now see that I was looking at a juvenile Pectoral Sandpiper, a rarity in Europe. I'd only ever seen one before, also at Hollowell Reservoir in August 2009. The bird had by now started to feed along the shoreline, but seemed settled, so I put the news out on the relevant channels and headed home to start my working day. The bird ended up remaining until October 29<sup>th</sup> and seen by many local birders and some from further afield. During its stay at Hollowell It was generally faithful to the north-west shoreline but was also often

seen feeding in the mat of weedy vegetation some distance from the water's edge and made a few forays to other parts of the reservoir shoreline. At times it was highly visible but could



also be lost to view as it hunkered down among tree roots and other debris exposed by recent low water levels.

Pectoral Sandpiper is a rare or scarce bird in the British Isles and is generally viewed as an American species. Its breeding territory in fact extends from Northern Siberia eastwards through Alaska and northern Canada as far as Hudson Bay. Trans-equatorial migrants, most of the population spends the winter in South America, with small numbers making it as far as Australia and New Zealand. The North American birds which turn up in Europe are thought to be affected by wind drift as they head south, perhaps getting caught up in Atlantic weather systems and carried across to Europe and the British Isles. Although a scarce / rare bird in the UK, this occurs often enough to make this species the commonest North American vagrant to be found here. It is also thought that some of the Siberian population may also head west pass through Europe in autumn, potentially on their way to wintering grounds in Africa. Jon Cook

celebrations are a reflection of the deeper truth of Christmas: that love came down to dwell among us, and that love still calls us to share it.






